Information for Parents

Child Protection (Safeguarding) In our Pastoral Care approach we aim to provide and sustain an atmosphere of caring for our pupils at all stages of their academic, spiritual, personal and social development.

The Principal coordinates the delivery of Pastoral Care in our School.

As part of our Pastoral Care Policy a Child Protection/Safeguarding Policy operates in Our Lady's P.S. In it we aim to protect our pupils as our main concern is that the care, welfare and safety of the children in our charge remain paramount.

To that end we ensure that:

- everyone who works in our school is aware of the signs and symptoms of all forms of abuse.
- there is a code of conduct for all staff.
- a security system is installed in the school.

All staff paid or unpaid who are appointed to positions in the School are vetted / supervised in accordance with relevant legislation and Departmental guidance.

In all cases of suspected child abuse in Our Lady's Primary School a strict procedure will be adhered to, that of informing Social Services and the Education Authority. The school will <u>not</u> be involved in investigating the suspected abuse.
