

## **NOVEMBER NEWSLETTER**

Dear Parent/Guardian,

As we begin the second half of term one and look towards the Christmas season, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all parents/guardians who attended our class curriculum evenings in September; the centenary Mass in the Church of the Immaculate Conception in October and the Parent Teacher meetings before the Halloween break. October was a brilliant month for our school with so many events including the fantastic exhibition of the children's work on the Church in the Community Centre, our Book Fair and the visit of Jason Mc Gahan and Colin Trainor with Sam Maguire, which was a particular highlight for all Gaelic enthusiasts. Hopefully Sam Maguire will return to Our Lady's, in the near future, decorated in the orange and white of Armagh. All these special occasions were brilliant experiences for our children and are available to view on our school website.

Please read the following important information regarding our school and planned events for the remainder of the half-term. Thanks.

**END OF YEAR SURVEYS:** At the end of the 21/22 school year, we completed surveys with pupils, parents and staff members. The results from the surveys were very positive regarding many aspects of our school which was very pleasing. Many of our children and parents acknowledged the dedication of our staff and the positive contribution they make to school life. The surveys identified the variety of learning and afterschool activities as strengths of our school as well as the very good facilities and the respectful relationships between all members of our school community, especially between staff and children.

The surveys also recommended areas for further development including a desire for a greater variety of afterschool activities, particularly ones that are not sporting related. An outdoor reading area was also on the wish list on the children's surveys as well as some fun activities such as a roller coaster or dog zoo. Parents also suggested that they would like: more Music teaching, training for staff on Autism and more communication regarding children's progress in school.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the parents who completed the surveys. Your time, responses and suggestions are very much appreciated. We have already started to work towards making some of these improvements to our school. We have purchased new tables for outside the P3 and P4 classrooms so that the children can read or draw during play times. Our School/ECO Council are currently carrying out a survey with our pupils regarding what afterschool activities they currently enjoy and what new activities they would like to be available for afterschool. We plan to host a fun family day in term 2 or term 3 to celebrate our 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary. We hope to have some fun activities organised for this event. Miss Holland, our new Primary One teacher, will teach Music in all our Primary 4-7 classes over the course of the school year on a Thursday afternoon. We have arranged Autism training for all teachers and classroom assistants on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> January with Autism NI. Regarding communication on children's progress in school we have already facilitated face to face Curriculum evenings for all classes in September. Our teachers met face to face with parents at the end of October for our annual parent teacher meetings. Parents may also contact the school to speak to a teacher afterschool on a Tuesday or Thursday if they have any queries regarding their child's progress. I have also included teachers email addresses below if you wish to email a teacher. Teachers have been directed to only respond to emails during school hours. During term 2

we hope to facilitate another contact between parents and teachers although we haven't established how this will be done, yet. Parents will receive an end of year written report as normal at the end of June.

I hope you will acknowledge that we have took on board the views of all members of our school community as we aspire to deliver high standards of teaching and learning in a safe and secure school environment for all children.
